1ST GRADE MUSIC

First Grade music class is filled with singing, playing classroom instruments and dancing! A strong focus for all primary music students is on keeping a steady beat. After reviewing contrasting elements of high/low, upward/downward and fast slow, first grades begin to read simple rhythms that contain quarter notes and eighth notes. They also begin to be able to identify *sol* and *mi* within simple songs. Later in the year, they are introduced to a quarter rest and the higher musical note, *la*.

By the end of 1st Grade....

Steady Beat

- Students will identify a steady beat
- Students will independently play a steady beat



Rhythm

Students can identify, read and play quarter note (ta), eighth notes (ti-ti) and rest to a steady beat

Melody



- Students will understand how the pitches of so, mi and la are related to one another on the staff
- Students will match pitch with *so, mi* and *la* patterns
- Students will read *so, mi* and *la* patterns on the staff

Contrasting Elements

Students will play, move and sing music that is fast/slow, high/low, loud/soft and short/long.
